The moment the blind man sees clearly, everything [changes](#):

Challenge:

“Knowing who Jesus is,

Am I willing to follow someone who sees better than I do?”

Talk It Over: “When seeing costs you more than you expect”

To Start Things off:

- Have you ever misjudged a situation or a person at first glance, only to later realize there was much more going on? What changed your perspective?

 **Dig Deeper**

Read **John 9:1-3**. What assumptions did the disciples make about the blind man? How did Jesus challenge those assumptions?

Read **John 9:24-34**. What stands out about the healed man’s response to the Pharisees? What about how the Pharisees treated the man?

Read **John 9:35-41**. What does Jesus mean when He says some who “see” are actually blind? Why is humility essential to spiritual clarity?

 **Personal Reflection**

Are there areas where you might be confidently “seeing” but actually missing what God is doing?

What would it look like for you to respond to Jesus with the simple honesty of, “I once was blind, but now I see”?
